They found out the pigs are omnivores, but that goats and sheep are herbivores. 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British Science Week

This week marks the 30th anniversary of British Science Week! For this, all children took part in a range of investigations based on the theme of time. In Reception, the children looked at how light can change objects over time. In Year I and 2, the children investigated what pendulums are and how we can change the length of time for a pendulum to stop. In Year 3 and 4, the children looked at the effect of particle sizes and explored the respiratory

system. Year 5 and 6 pupils designed a farm based on the future, looking at how farmers would be able to look after the planet in the future. We hope the children enjoyed their investigations!

Thrive allows staff to profile children's social and emotional development and set targets and write action plans to support development in this area. It also allows staff to identify gaps in social and emotional development and plan for specific interventions to fill these gaps. What will happen if I report child abuse?

Childcare agencies believe that children are best cared for by their parents. Children are rarely removed from their parents and most families are given help and support. Social Workers can only remove children from home with a court order and only after they have demonstrated that the child is at serious risk. If you would like to speak to someone in school about your concerns the above members of staff are Designated Safeguarding Leads and will be happy to listen to your concerns and take the appropriate steps to safeguard a child.
