






Road Safety

We appreciate it is extremely busy around school during drop off and collection times however, unfortunately we have already observed several incidents that put yourselves and your children at risk of serious injury. To avoid such an incident can we politely remind you of the following key points...



• Children in Reception, Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3 MUST be escorted on to the playground and all child attending breakfast club (regardless of year group) MUST be signed in by an adult.

 Please cross at the crossing points. Several parents and children have been crossing on the corners which is extremely dangerous.

• Late children MUST be signed in at the office by an adult. Once the gate has closed there will be no staff outside to safeguard your child.

- Scooters and bikes MUST NOT be ridden on the playgrounds.
- If your child is making their own way into school, please ensure they do not arrive before 8:35am. On several occasions children have been outside school unaccompanied for a period of time before the school gates open.
- No animals should be bought into the school grounds.
- Please also consider the use of mobile phones on the playground and where possible.


orimary/ Half term holiday club – GAME ON

If you think that a child is at immediate risk, contact the police immediately by dialling **999**.

What will happen if I report child abuse?

Childcare agencies believe that children are best cared for by their parents. Children are rarely removed from their parents and most families



are given help and support. Social Workers can only remove children from home with a court order and only after they have demonstrated that the child is at serious risk.

If you would like to speak to someone in school about your concerns the above members of staff are Designated Safeguarding Leads and will be happy to listen to your concerns and take the appropriate steps to safeguard a child.

Support for Families

Family and Relationship programs

Being a parent is probably the most demanding job you will ever have but you are not alone. Did you know that there is a wealth of support for parents and carers in Warwickshire?

Parents/carers can access advice in a variety of ways, from online guides you can read though, virtual 2-hour workshops on a range of topics delivered via MS Teams in the evenings and face-to-face workshops and programs which take place around the County.

Being part of a group can help you realise you are not alone with many of the concerns you have, and it can be encouraging to recognise and build upon your existing skills at the same time as sharing and learning from other parents and carers.

There are many reasons why you may want to attend a workshop or program, this is what some parents have shared in the past:

I wasn't 100% sure what the course would be about, but it helped a great deal with our general parenting.

Was a fun group to be in and was very friendly and supportive.

I have learnt that too much emphasis is put on children's behaviour and not on the how the adults in their lives are supporting them. Our universal offer is open to any parent who resides in Warwickshire or has a child looked after in Warwickshire.

Online guides are a good first port of call and can be worked through independently or with support. They cover a wide range of support from antenatal binding to teen years and mental health.

Our 2-hour workshops are face to face and virtual and are offered around the county. They provide an overview of topic and some simple strategies to go away and try. The longer programs (5-10wks) offer more in-depth information and an opportunity for connection. No referral is needed, and parents can book themselves on via Exemptitie.
